Our Outdoor Education program provides curriculum and facilitation for outdoor experiences that support educational objectives, classroom curriculum, and extends the opportunity for academic, social, and emotional growth to more than 4,000 students each year and growing. The opportunity to foster growth in communication, leadership, and problem solving skills is a part of every outdoor education program offered at Highland Lakes Camp.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Prepare contracts with groups and potential groups who may participate in outdoor education
- Follow Up with group leaders and schools as they prepare to participate in Outdoor Education programs
- Seek and maintain effective communication between the camp, school districts, and community groups for the purpose of collaborative planning.
- Work with the Director to create and implement a comprehensive recreation and outdoor education program.
- Help lead instruction and facilitation of our recreation and outdoor education
- Work with the Director to write and make curriculum adjustments (as needed) to comply with the 5th Grade Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) standards.
- Compile and maintain necessary records for participating students and staff or sponsors.
- Help maintain all areas of recreation, challenge course and outdoor education.

Qualifications

- Degree in Education or Recreation
- Communication skills to work effectively with professional staff and parents.

- Experience in outdoor adventure education or related fields.
- Willingness to be certified in areas such as lifeguarding, archery, challenge course etc.
- Ability to problem solve, schedule daily activities, model good communication skills, and work with schools and families to meet student's individual needs.
- Positive, encouraging, and uplifting attitude toward all people and in all communication. Ready to have fun.
- Willing to live at Highland Lakes Camp and Conference Center

Physical Condition

- Good overall health is necessary.

- Be able to work outdoors in a variety of weather conditions including summer heat.
