JOB OVERVIEW:

The Camp Health Center Manager is responsible for:

- (1) the storage, safety, and disbursement of all medications,
- (2) treating minor injuries, accidents, and sickness
- (3) Health Center upkeep
- (4) Supervising Summer Staff Health team

These four functions must be conducted in a manner which prioritizes the safety of our guests and exemplifies the care of Christ. Due to the 24 hour on-call requirement, the person holding this position must stay in Highland Lakes Camp provided lodging during the contracted work period.

TYPICAL SCHEDULE:

Opening Day of Camp: 10 AM–10:30 PM

Full Camp Days: 7 AM-10:30 PM

Closing Day of Camp: 7 AM – Noon

24 hour on call status

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Storage, Safety, and Disbursement of all Medications
- Collect all medications from group leaders on opening day

- Log, organize, and store medications and records in a secure manner
- Dispense and log medications as directed
- Return all medications to group leaders on closing day
- · Availability for treatment of minor injuries, accidents, and sickness
- Evaluate and respond to campers' complaints of sickness and injury under the guidance of standing orders set by the on-call physician
- Log all visits and actions taken
- Respond to emergency calls in accordance with Highland Lakes Camp Emergency Action
- Plan/Evaluate/stabilize patients awaiting emergency transport or parent pickup
- Health Center Upkeep
- Keep the Health Center neat and sanitary
- Communicate inventory needs to Highland Lakes Camp Management

- Must be a licensed physician, registered nurse, licensed vocational nurse,
